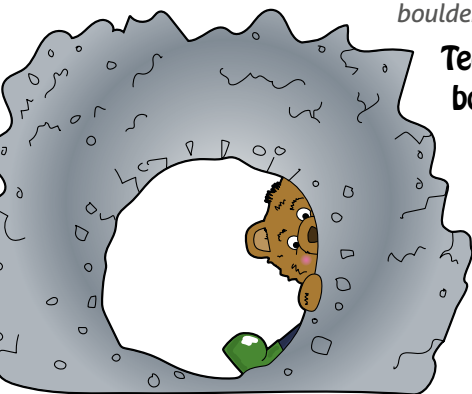
Turn left, signposted 'Park Centre and Castle'.

"If you look carefully you can see her face and you can make a wish. Don't tell anyone what you have wished for though, or your wish may never come true."

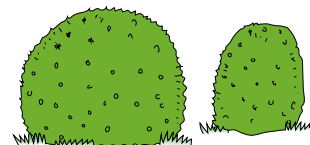
Walk across the grass towards the front of the Castle.

Go up the steps (or around if you have a buggy) and walk left around the castle.

Turn right towards the church and go through an archway (Café/Castle toilets here)

Turn right at the gatehouse

They saw stone arches next to a large mound.

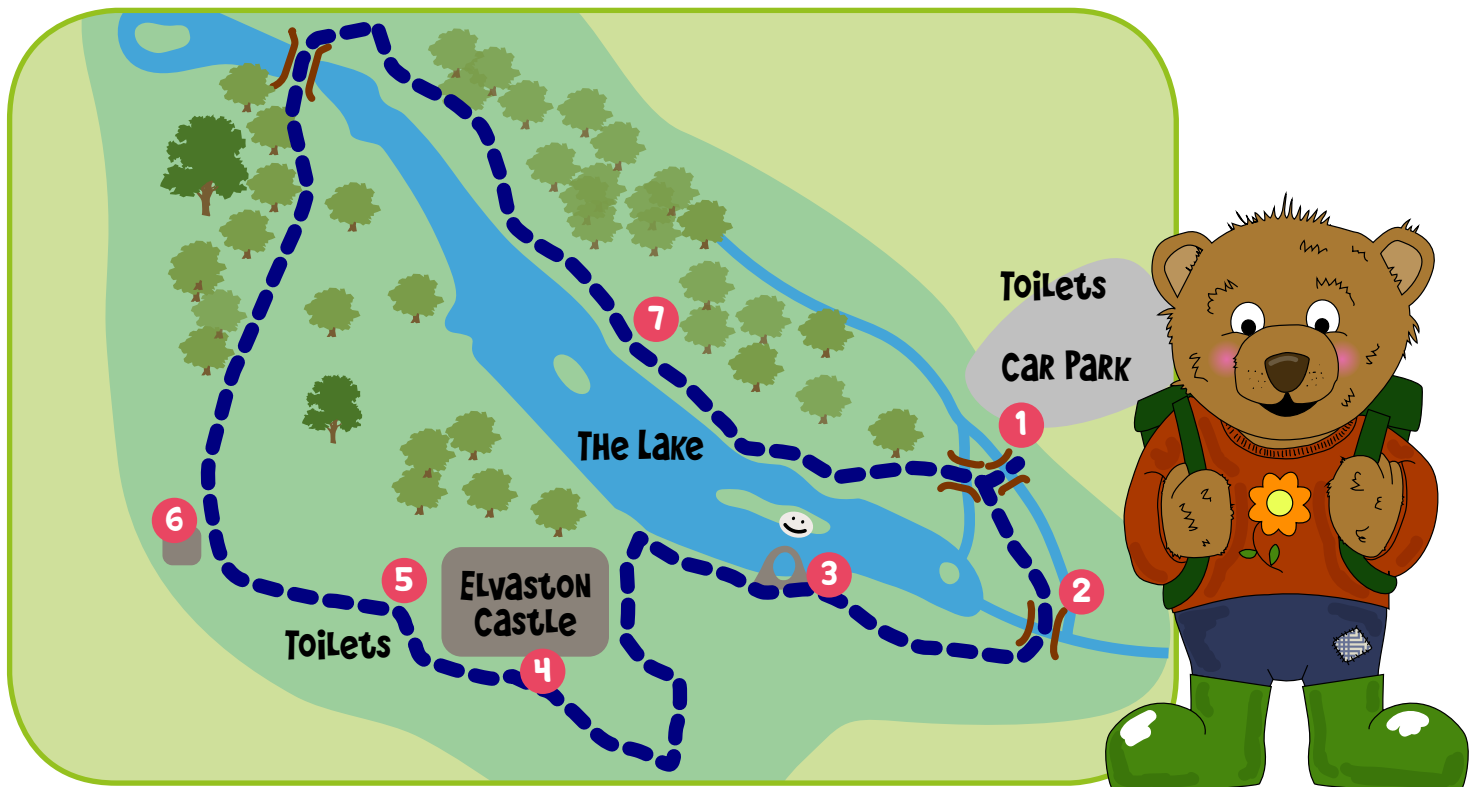
